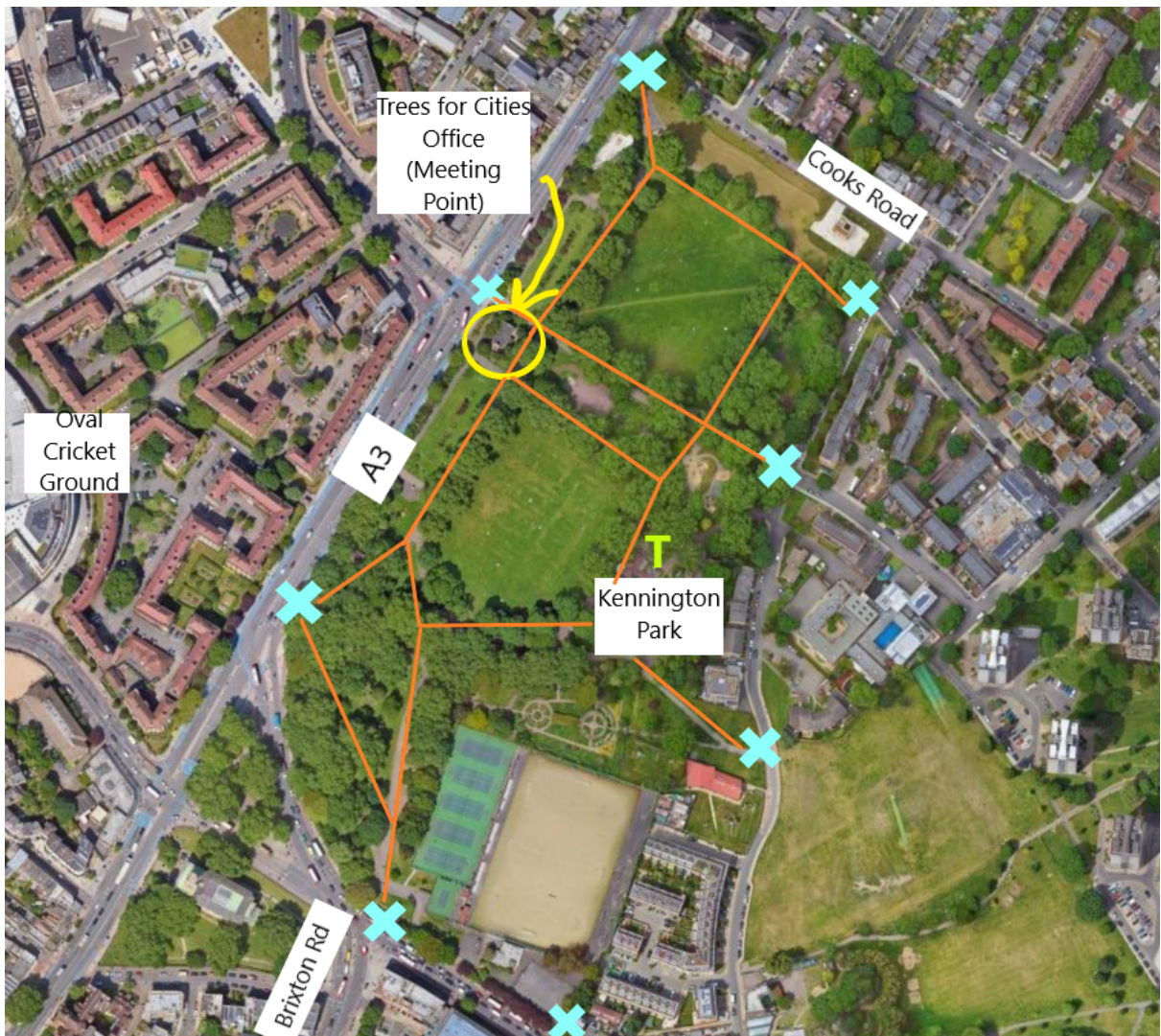

Site Information

Kennington Park is in the Borough of Lambeth in London. The postcode for the park is SE11 4BE.

There are 8 main entrances to the park. There are concreted flat pathways throughout the park.

Below is a birds-eye view map of Kennington Park. See the next page for a key.



The blue crosses mark entrances to the site. All entrances are no smaller than 3ft 2in wide. All entrances are gates that remain open during the day.

The orange lines mark concreted flat pathways.

The green T marks accessible toilets (inside the Park Cafe).

The yellow circle marks the Trees for Cities office. This is the meeting point for the activity. Please see a street-view picture of the meeting point below.

Please note: We may leave the pathways during this activity, and advance onto the grass to look closer at the trees we are identifying. When on the grass we will approach the trees slowly, to ensure the group remains together.

We advise you to use an all-terrain wheelchair, if you need and have access to one. If you have any concerns about the terrain, please contact Hetty. Her details are at the top of the first page.

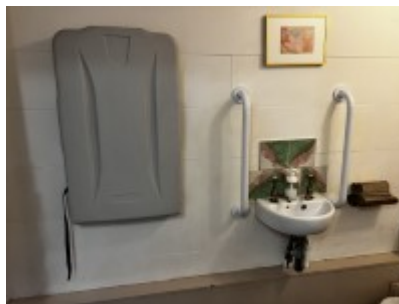
We will alert everyone of any uneven surfaces when leaving pathways.

Toilets

The park toilets are closed during May 2023, due to playground re-construction.

There are toilets available in Kennington Park Cafe. There is one disabled access toilet available in the Cafe. It is approximately 12m from the Cafe entrance.

The door to the toilet is approximately 2ft 9in wide. The toilet is approximately 4ft 3in x 7ft 10in.

Parking

There are two blue badge holder disabled parking spaces on St Agnes Road. The parking spaces measure 7ft 7in x 15ft 1in. They are approximately 250 metres from the meeting point for this activity.



There is no public parking lot within 200m of the park. There are on-street parking spaces along Cooks Road. There is no official drop-off point.

Who will be there

Trees for Cities staff:

- **Sophie** (she/her), our Design Lead, will be leading the activity. Sophie can answer any questions you have about identifying trees, and their characteristics.
- **Hetty**, Engagement Coordinator (she/her). Hetty is the point of contact for this activity. If you need anything before, during, or after the activity, please call or email her. Her details are on the first page of this document. She will wear a high-vis during the activity.
- **John**, Senior Engagement Coordinator (he/him). John has worked at the Charity for a long time and can answer any questions you have about the organisation.

- **Dan**, Engagement Coordinator (he/him). Dan has lots of experience working across community groups. He is very friendly and will help you in any way you may need assistance.

Other activity participants - This will be members of the public who have signed up to the event. We will be limiting numbers to 30 people, but the group size may vary according to children present, and last minute drop-ins.

Activity Timings

We advise participants to turn up at least five minutes before the activity starts at 2pm. This gives us time to greet everyone before the activity begins. We may ask people to introduce themselves, if you do not wish to do so, you do not have to participate. Please contact Hetty if you have any concerns about this.

You are welcome to turn up earlier if you would like to greet the Trees for Cities team on your own. Please let Hetty know before the activity date what time you would like to arrive.

We will stay as a group throughout the activity. You are welcome to stand away from the group if you need to. Please be aware that you may need to stand closer to the activity leader to hear what they are saying.

We will then spend an hour moving across the park to look at different trees, advising on how to identify them by their leaves, bark, flowers and other characteristics. We will spend approximately 10 minutes at each tree, but this may vary depending on questions from the participants and information given from the activity leader.

There will hopefully be 5 minutes at the end of the activity to ask any last questions. However, this time may vary depending on whether questions have been asked throughout the activity.

Assistance

There will be no BSL interpreter present at this activity.

There will be no signs or widgets available at this activity.
